The Coordinator will lead the development and implementation of outreach activities and facilitate the creation of the Acequia Outdoor Learning Spaces. This space will serve as a community resource to educate and engage local communities on sustainable land and water sharing practices. The Coordinator will work closely with state and local agencies, community partners, and stakeholders to ensure the success of these initiatives.

Key Responsibilities:

• Outreach Coordination:

- Develop and implement outreach strategies to engage community members, local organizations, and Indigenous groups in the Acequia Outdoor Learning Space initiative.
- Build and maintain strong relationships with state and local agencies, community leaders, and stakeholders to foster collaboration and support for the project.
- Organize and facilitate community meetings, workshops, and events to raise awareness and educate the public on sustainable agriculture, water rights, and conservation practices.

- Project Management:
 - Coordinate the planning, design, and construction of the Acequia Outdoor Learning Space, ensuring that it aligns with the cultural values and practices of local communities.
 - Monitor project progress, manage timelines, and ensure that project goals and objectives are met.
 - Oversee project budget, track expenses, and ensure compliance with funding requirements.
- Partnership Development:
